#### 1.0. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. The engagement of citizens to further develop our dear State would enhance the gathering of thought processes in the preparation of the 2022 Budget and the 2022 2024 Medium-Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF). The Prince Dapo Abiodun MFR led Administration in Ogun State had religiously been committed to inclusiveness, openness, accountability and transparency in the preparation of the State's yearly Budget. Having begun with holding of Town Hall Meetings in the three (3) different Senatorial Districts of the State in 2019, while preparing for the 2020 Budget, the new status-quo has become sustained, having the State Governor as the Chief Host present in all the three (3) Senatorial Districts.
- 1.2. The 2022 Town Hall Meeting was held virtually to have a wide spread participation during the meeting chaired by the State Governor, Prince (Dr.) Dapo Abiodun MFR. Invitations were sent to several stakeholders across the Ogun West Senatorial District that included Political Leaders, Traditional Rulers, Trade and Women Associations; Community Development Associations; Religious and Student Bodies; Youth Representatives; Civil Society Organizations / NGOs; Professional Bodies; Organized Private Sector; Trade Unions and other Stakeholders of the State.
- 1.3. The consultative virtual session was anchored by the State Ministry of Budget and Planning, saddled with the preparation of the annual budget and central planning activities in the State. The Master of Ceremony (MC) for the occassion, Mr. Adewole Dosunmu briefed the session giving an overview of the benefit of having this meeting. In addition he added that participants could join the session on-line while other contributions were welcomed through email( <a href="mailto:tomiwaosibodu@yahoo.com">tomiwaosibodu@yahoo.com</a>) and whatapp as well as direct presentation to this ministry.

## 2.0. ATTENDANCE AT THE MEETING

The virtual session had over 245 participants who successfully logged in across 2.1. the representatives from the various stakeholders in the Ogun West Senatorial District, this including the Women Organizations to ensure gender balance. In attendance were His Excellency, the Executive Governor of the State, Prince Dapo Abiodun MFR; Her Excellency, the Deputy Governor of the State, Engr. (Mrs.) Noimot Salako-Oyedele; the Speaker of the State House of Assembly, Rt. Hon. Olakunle Oluomo; the Secretary to the State Government, Mr. Tokunbo Talabi; the Head of Service, Alhaja Selimot Olapeju Ottun; the Chief of Staff, Alhaji Salisu Shuaib; The Chief Economic Adviser and Honourable Commissioner of Finance, Mr. Dapo Okubadejo, Honourable Commissioner of Mr. Olaolu Olabimtan; other Honourable State Budget & Planning, Commissioners; Honourable Members of the State House of Assembly; the Body of Permanent Secretaries, Special Advisers, Local Government Chairmen; representatives of the Traditional Institutions; Chairmen of Statutory Boards and Commissions; Community Development Associations; All Progressive Congress Party State Chairman and other Chieftains of Political Parties; Religious and Student Bodies; Youth Representatives; Civil Society Organizations and Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs); Professional Bodies; Organized Private Sector; Trade Unions and other Stakeholders of the State.

### 3.0. OPENING

The moderator, Mr. Wole Dosunmu, signified the commencement of the meeting at 11:10am with the recognition of the dignitaries from the Ogun West Senatorial District, the Local Government Chairmen from the District, Royal fathers, Civil Societies and other stakeholders present. The rendition of both the National and Ogun State Anthems was said at 11.20am. Thereafter, the opening prayer was offered by the Honourable Commissioner for Culture & Tourism, Dr. Oluwatoyin

Talwo. The moderator noted that, selected representatives from the various stakeholders would be allowed to make their contributions.

#### 4.0. WELCOME ADDRESS

- 4.1. The Honourable Commissioner for Budget and Planning, Mr. Olaolu Olabimtan FCA began his address by welcoming everyone to the 2<sup>nd</sup> series of the virtual Town Hall Meeting (Ogun West Senatorial District) after successfully holding that of Ogun East to prepare for the 2022 - 2024 cycle and the year 2022 Budget. He mentioned that the grand finale was for Ogun Central which would be held on Friday 29th October, 2021. He stated further that, Prince Dapo Abiodun's Administration was committed to good governance and efficient service delivery amongst other commitment which our dear governor has expatiated at different fora. One of the essentials of good governance was Public Financial System which entailed engaging the citizens and feeling their purse to draw up a people's budget and expenditure framework that would proffer answers to the yearnings of the populace. He noted it was a unique one considering the fact that Ogun State has had to deal largely with the effects of the Covid-19 which ravaged the entire world earlier in the year. However, in the same pro-active spirit of the Governor, Prince Dapo Abiodun MFR in dealing with these effects, he explained that the Town Hall meeting was to further obtain the thoughts and contributions of the citizens for the preparation of the year 2022 - 2024 Medium Term Expenditure Framework and the 2022 Budget.
- 4.2. Furthermore, the Honourable Commissioner stated that, since the inception of the Prince Dapo Abiodun-led Administration in the State, the invaluable support, cooperation and assistance of the citizenry have fuelled Government's aspirations towards moving Ogun State forward. He said that, Ogun State had experienced tremendous improvement in various sectors and this was an attestation to the fact that this Administration was continually working at

eliminating poverty and under development according to best global practices that will effectively reach out to every citizen of the State, who equally have a significant role to play in ensuring that these goals and aspirations were accomplished.

4.3. He also reminded the citizens that the meeting was an opportunity to lay bare their opinions since it had become both the individual and collective responsibility of everyone to restore the status of our dear State beyond the setback experienced as a result of Covid-19. He equally said that the relevant stakeholders had been invited to interact with His Excellency and engage him first hand.

He noted that it was a unique opportunity to have a sincere and important discussion on the way forward.

He noted that the purpose of the meeting were:

- (i) To sensitize the citizens about Government plans and priorities for 2020-2024 in furtherance of the mantra-Building our future together.
- (ii) To obtain the thoughts and contributions of the stakeholders as the MTEF 2022-2024, and the budget for 2022.
- On behalf of His Excellency, he appreciated everyone who had taken time to be part of the programme.
- 4.4. As he rounded off his address, the Honourable Commissioner for Budget and Planning on behalf of His Excellency appreciated everyone who took out time to be part of the meeting, though virtual. He encouraged individuals, Community Development Associations, Cooperative Societies, Non-Governmental Organizations, Religious bodies, Traditional Rulers, Student bodies, etc. to make their contributions at the meeting while assuring that all would be attended to such that together, our dear State would be moved forward.

4.5. He once again welcomed everybody to the Ogun West Senatorial District Town hall Meeting. Being a process that cannot be over-emphasized, he implored participants to be fully part of the consultation as he anticipated fruitful engagement for the benefit of our dear State.

## 5.0. GOODWILL MESSAGE

- 5.1. The Honourable Commissioner for Finance / Chief Economic Adviser, Mr. Dapo Okubadejo, in his Goodwill message, noted that the Town Hall meeting marked another day in our quest for inclusive and participatory governance in Ogun State, as was also held the previous day for Ogun East. He welcomed everyone to the town hall meeting for Ogun West Senatorial District of Ogun State. The commissioner equally noted that Ogun West was very significant in the economic profile as a result of the Industrial capacity in the Senatorial District. He explained that this exercise was global best practice in Public Financial Management Reform Initiatives because it was giving a lot of people and citizens the opportunity to participate in budget preparation and ultimately in decision making process in the State as well. For the first time, the Medium Term Revenue Strategy (MTRS) framework was introduced so as to ensure that our focus remained on what that were important.
- 5.2 He noted that, budget preparation could be done either by using incremental approach or zero-based budgeting approach. The State adopted the zero-based approach that makes us ask the question "why are spending money?", "what the money is meant for?" and "how much we really need to spend?" In addition, by introducing the Medium Term Revenue Strategy, our budget preparation would no longer be hinged on the cost, but now driven largely by the revenue capacity and the potentials of the State that helps to strategized and come up with a lot of initiatives and how we could continue to remain relevant. He talked about the Ogun State Land and Revenue Management System (OLARMS) to help

harness all land resources and enable the dealing of land matters in a transparent manner. The digital transformation was an integral part of the key enablers. While this has begun yielding key results. The Commissioner also noted that as at September 2021, the Internally Generated Revenue stood at Seventy-four Billion Naira and also optimistic of reaching over 100 Billion Naira by the end of the year. He noted that this puts the State on a sustainable path to self-actualization, to economic transformation and trying to harness a lot of other resources by the creation of the economic development clusters across the State to catalyze industrialization in the State, and sustain our position as the foremost industrial hub in the country. This would help us take full advantage of the recently executed African Continental Free Trade Agreement that seeks to position Nigeria as the foremost industrial Hub in the continent of Africa. The African Continental Free Trade Agreement is actually one of the biggest economic blocks in the world. If properly harnessed would then position Africa as a competitive location and also ignite industrialization, of which Ogun State would play a key role in this range. He recalled that at the emergence of the Prince Dapo Abiodun-led Administration in Ogun State, the people were promised a good public financial management system that would be transparent, accountable with the ultimate goal of public deliverables. However, he noted that the experience has been quite challenging, yet interesting particularly from the onslaught of the covid-19 pandemic on the economic survival of the State. He stated that the State had survived so far as a result of belt tightening and costcutting measures to survive under the anticipated steep decline in the finances of the State Government.

5.3. Government will further entrench revenue strategies in 2022 with the redeployment of further digital initiatives and utmost reliance on our Internally Generated Revenue. Would continue to focus on infrastructural development of projects that were not only economically viable but also financially viable, the

- much-needed resources would be provided, as well as employment opportunities for the teeming youths. He encouraged all the stakeholders to bear with Government in the task of building our State.
- 5.4. The Honourable Commissioner for Finance / Chief Economic Adviser appreciated the Royal Fathers, Representatives of Traditional Councils, Religious Leaders, Community Development Associations, Cooperative Societies, the Organized Private Sector, Professional Bodies, Trade Associations, Non-Governmental / Civil Society Organizations, Labour and Student Unions, amongst others. He implored everyone to remain committed and continually support the present Administration to deliver the dividends of democracy under the leadership of the captain of the ship, Prince Dapo Abiodun MFR.

#### 6.0. HIS EXCELLENCY'S REMARKS

6.1. The Governor Prince (Dr.) Dapo Abiodun MFR, joined others to welcome all the dignitaries, stakeholders and all other persons to the virtual Ogun West Senatorial District Town-Hall meeting. His Excellency recalled that the meeting was the 2<sup>nd</sup> in the series of Townhall meetings for the preparation of the 2022-2024 Medium Term Expenditure Framework and year 2022 Budget preparation. Having held the Ogun East Senatorial District meeting on Wednesday, 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2021, that commenced the interface with the people of Ogun State to discuss budget matters for the coming year. The Governor emphasised that the Administration he led was elected to build the progress of the State by ensuring that all people from the three (3) Senatorial Districts had equal opportunities and to rub minds with those who held the public trust to govern the people, so that every citizen could make inputs for the Government to set the priorities of the people to ensure even development and inclusive governance in the state.

- According to Mr. Governor The meeting was another promise made and promise kept.
- 6.2. In the engagement of the good people of Ogun west, His Excellency reiterated that Ogun State is a Gateway State because of the fortuitous circumstances and geographical location of Ogun West which is the major outlet to West African States. The Governor noted that it was a self-evident truth that without this Senatorial District, Ogun State would not be an International Gateway State. He therefore considered the District a priority not just because it was also the industrial engine room of the state but because the people of Ogun West who are the priceless jewels and also the Industrial capital of Nigeria having the largest composition of factories and Industrial hub in the country.

Ogun West is the home of Agbara Industrial Estate, which was one of the largest in sub-Saharan Africa. This same District is the home of over 400 Nationals and multi-national brands. In fact, the same Agbara Estate attracted the relocation of Ogun Guandong Free Trade Zone at Igbesa, which is also in the Senatorial District, and still remains viable, ongoing commercial hub. Speaking further, His Excellency stated that it was obvious that his Administration was irrevocably committed to making Ogun State a truly investors choice destination not only in Nigeria but in Africa and considered the welfare of the citizens and commerce in Ogun West non-negotiable.

6.3. The Governor was quick to mention the completion of Ray Power Road, Ikola Ikosi Ota Road to open up other towns along Kola and Alagbado-Ipaja border, for more investment and continued social economic development in the area and also provide a by-pass. Earlier this year, specifically April 29<sup>th</sup> 2021 his administration turned the sword of the 19km Atan Lusada-Agbara road and commissioning of 10.25km Lusada-Igbesa roads in the same Local Government. His Excellency stated that Atan-Lusada road was the most expensive road constructed in his Administration. He noted that the State Government was

working on an alternative intervention plan to expedite the construction of Ilaro/Owode-Idiroko roads which was a Federal road just like was done with the Epe-Ijebu Ode Road, Sagamu -Abeokuta Road. The State awaits the Federal Government approval on the transfer of the reconstruction of Lagos/Ota-Abeokuta Road. However, palliatives work on that road to fix the failed portions was a continuous exercise.

- 6.4. He further explained that an illustrious son of the State, Otunba Mike Adenuga had been committed to reconstruct the 64km Ota-Idiroko International Road through the tax credit scheme, ditto for Alhaji Aliko Dangote was granted approval to reconstruct 100km Ilaro Papalanto- Sagamu Interchange roads also through tax credit scheme. These are initiatives that the Dapo Abiodun led Administration promoted in line with the commitment to strengthen Public Private Sector Partnership. The Government would continue to improve on the PPP programmes by identifying necessary funding options for the rehabilitation and reconstruction of major roads in the State. The administration understands as it concerned transportation on some of the roads. His Excellency therefore pleaded for patience and understanding of the citizenry and assured that the State Government was not looking away from their plight.
- 6.5. Furthermore, the Governor stated that his administration was constructing road projects across 18 out of 20 Local Government Areas out of which cut across the five (5) Local Government areas in Ogun West namely:
  - Yewa North: Imasayi/Igan Okoto/Ayetoro roads
  - Imeko Afon: Oke Ola/Ago Osofa road
  - Ipokia: Oke Afa, Bridge at Ago shasha is ongoing.
  - Ado-Odo/Ota: Joju Oju oore road is ongoing.
  - Yewa South: Owode/llaro road would be completed expeditiously
- 6.6. In the area of affordable Housing, His Excellency's administration has commenced the building of affordable housing units in the hearts of llaro and also

assured that construction of housing unit would also commence in earnest at Ado-Odo/Ota Local Government as the required landed space for units of medium income housing for it had been secured. His Excellency equally pointed out that local labourers, electricians, suppliers and artisans in the area would be involved with the construction of these housing units. This was to underscore the needs to provide the needed employment and economic sustainability as well as improve the standard of living of the dear people across all sectors and sections of Ogun West District. He stated the yellow roofs called the "Yellow-Roof Revolution" characterizing the primary, secondary schools and the primary health centres.

- 6.7. The Governor stated that his Administration had done and would continue work on job creation, poverty elevation and food security. He assured the general public that the government would not rest on its laurels but would continue to demonstrate commitment in the development of partnership in education, health, infrastructure, commerce, youth development, agriculture and other pillar sectors that have direct and positive impacts on the lives of people of the State. In each of the approved 236 wards Imeko (52 projects); Yewa North (76 projects), Yewa South (66 projects), amongst many others. General Hospital in Idiroko, procuring equipment in Ado- Ota (80-Bed capacity isolation center, in the wake of Covid-19. In Ogun West in particular, there was increase in ambulance services by 4, and well equipped with state of the art equipment, one each at Ota, Idiroko, Ilaro and Ayetoro.
- 6.8. He further thanked the royal fathers, community leaders, Baale's and members of the Hunters' Association who had been supporting the security to ensure the safety of lives and property across the Senatorial Districts in particular and the State in general especially during the Farmers-Herders conflict earlier this year in part of the Ogun West Senatorial District.

6.9. As the Governor called on relevant stakeholders to continue to cooperate and collaborate with his Administration towards building a viable future of our dear State, he rounded off his address by welcoming all participants once again to the important Town Hall virtual meeting in Ogun West Senatorial District.

# 7.0. CONTRIBUTIONS

- 7.1. HRM Oba (Dr) Kehinde Gbadewole Olugbenle Olu of Ilaro, Paramount Ruler of Yewaland in his speech, appreciated the Executive Governor of Ogun State for his prompt response to the Ogun West Senatorial District meeting last year. He specifically noted that the Owode/llaro Road construction, llara/ljohun/Oja Odan Roads was at a slow pace and enjoined the Governor to mobilise the contractors to go back to the site. He further stated that there were inadequate teachers in both Primary and Secondary Schools in the zone, he advised his Excellency that the newly recruited teachers by Teaching Service Commission should be posted to the three zones in the State. He mentioned that there was shortage of doctors and nurses in the Public Hospitals. He suggested that the Governor should employ more doctors and nurses and post them to the Community Health Centres in the State. He thanked the Governor that work had commenced at the Housing Scheme at Ilaro, that he should increase the housing units in the Senatorial Zone to give room for more people to have access to the Housing scheme. He further recommended that security measures should be put in place as we were fast approaching the dry season for herders encroaching of farmlands in the Ogun West Senatorial District.
- 7.2. HRH Oba (Prof.) Adeyemi Kabiru Obelanlege— Olota of Ota, appreciated the Governor on the Atan Lusada road construction and various palliatives works that were on-going at Awori town. He said the Ota Housing Scheme would be oversubscribed when commenced. He mentioned that the Governor should construct the roads that led to Ojodu Berger/Lanbe/Ijoko, Bible

College/Animashaun/Singer Road. He stated that His Excellency should build modern library for the growing numbers of students in the community. He further suggested that Information Communication Technology, Igbesa should be upgraded to a degree awarding University. He also spoke about the underdeveloped allocated land at Ogun State Housing Corporation land, Sango and suggested that it should be revoked and re-allocated to individuals willing to develop the lands. He further mentioned that the Gateway Hotel at Sango Ota, which is was a goldmine, needed urgent attention as people of the underworld had turned the place to a hide-out.

7.3. Alhaji Gboyega Nasir Isiaka (GNI) – He thanked the Executive Governor of the State for given him the opportunity to serve in his administration. He emphasized on the need to tighten the security and enforce law and order in the State, he cited an example of the Custom Officers/Locals feud that happened few days before the Town hall meeting that commercial motorcycles and cars were burnt in the Senatorial District.

## 7.4. Tajudeen Adeleye (Chairman, Youth Council for Ogun West)

- He advised the Government to be more focused on the Education Sector, and increased monitoring to reduce unruliness. To also review the technical education curriculum in order to reduce unemployment which would increase the State GDP.
- He stressed the need for Infrastructural Development in roads leaking the five Local Government areas in the Ogun West Senatorial Zone.
- Recruitment of more teachers e.g like in Ayetoro Senior Secondary Class, where there was no Physics, Further Mathematics Teachers.

## 7.5. Dr.lyabo Okulaja (Women Group Leader, Ogun West)

 As regard Women Economic Security: she appealed for increasing women participation in education, training and employment by awarding scholarship to indigent girls.

- Further investment to women in areas of science, technology, engineering mathematics and more support to women.
- She talked about women with disabilities to be catered for through the ministry of women affairs
- The next budget should be gender sensitive like having access to soft loans, "Okowo Dapo" etc.

#### 7.6. Senator Akin Odunsi

- Reconstruction of major roads at Ado -Odo Ota, one of the most industrialized parts of the State
- Empowerment of youths through the establishment of Trade centres, regarding arts and crafts to enable young people become independent.

#### 7.7. Mrs. Cynthia Saka

- She appreciated the government on effort made so far. She noted the rehabilitation of roads in Ogun West Senatorial District and the Agbara/ Atan/ Ota to create an industrial park for revenue generation.
- Waste Management- Recycling equipment, such as empty plastic bottles turning it into big business and thereby generating revenue from it.
- For technical colleges, she stated that the technical colleges should be refurblished.

### 7.8. Apostle John Lola Dada

- Employment of teachers for Public Primary and Secondary Schools in the State
- Dangote Trucks should be stopped from parking on the main road to avoid vehicular accident.
- He noted the area of roads and said that the Governor was doing everything that Ogun West was not marginalized. He said the Imasayi/ Iboro/Ayetoro road that was abandoned had now been given attention.

### 7.9. Honourable Kayode Oladele

- Internally Generated Revenue of Seventy-four Billion(74bn) commendable based on the team work of the Ministry of Budget and Planning and Ministry of Finance
- He commended the Governor for setting up the Farmers Herders Committee, as being proactive as the dry season was approaching.
- Trans-Yewa Road- linking 5 Local Governments. It starts from Ilara and ended at Ilase. He said that the last administration said it would be completed, but was not.
- He pleaded for the completion of roads which would open up investment opportunities.
- Noted the Abeokuta/ Imeko/ Iwoye road. A Federal Government Road, which had the global headquarters of the Celestial Church.

## 7.10. Mr.Abdul Jabar Ayelagbe

• Infrastructural Development in our primary and secondary schools.

## 7.11. Mrs.Oluyomi Dawodu

Government should intensify efforts in the area of security and agriculture.
 She emphasized the area of security owing to the potential in Ogun West based on agriculture and value chain. She pleaded for better agriculture involving the young people. She prayed to God to keep strengthening the Governor to prosper Ogun West and the State in general.

## 7.12. Mr. Dolamu Adebayo

- Agitated for land for farmers in Ogun West Senatorial District.
- Provision of electricity for small industries, he noted that Government should also intensify efforts in the area of security and agriculture.

 He noted that the roads he discussed with the Governor where now under construction. On the Fire Station, he noted that it was almost completed.
 He also noted that there was a rumor of the bridge at Lusada to be pulled down.

## 8.0. THE GOVERNOR'S RESPONSE

- 8.1. His Excellency, Prince (Dr.) Dapo Abiodun MFR appreciated all the eminent sons and daughters of Ogun West Senatorial district led by the Paramount ruler of Yewa Land, HRM Oba (Dr) Kehinde Gbadewole Olugbenle, Olu of Ilaro for their contributions and suggestions. His Excellency stated that as the Government prepared for the year 2022-2024 Medium Term Expenditure Framework and year 2022 Budget, his Administration was determined to continue to be an inclusive and participatory Government giving a lot of people and citizens the opportunity to participate in budget preparation and ultimately in decision making in the State as well.
- 8.2. He continued by noting that he would look for a way to enhance the pace at which the roads in the five (5) local government areas in Yewa Land are reconstructed by quickly mobilising contractors back to site in order to speed up the reconstruction of the roads at both ends and possibly finish at the shortest possible time especially the Ilaro/Papalanto road which was very important to Ogun State Government.
- 8.3. The Kabiyesi's issue on the by-pass roads to complement Governments efforts or alternative routes to the federal roads. The Itele- Sango/Ijoko road, about 16kms. The Governor noted that the road was water-locked and cost the government a lot of money. He said this would be put on the wish list and see what could be done in the future. The Governor noted that the government could not afford upgrading any institution into a full pledged university at this point.

- 8.2. He stated that the Ministry of Housing had been directed to build not less than 100 units of Housing Scheme at Ilaro Housing Estate and as well visit the Housing Corporation Land at Ota and to carry out an assessment of the underdeveloped allocated land at Ogun State Housing Corporation land, Sango Ota in order to be re-allocated to individuals who were willing to develop the lands.
- 8.3. His Excellency responded further on the request and contribution from the people and stated that on the construction of TECH-HUB, that the Bureau of Information Communication Technology would look into possibility of having one at Ado-Odo (to complement the Tech-Hub at Abeokuta) while the Ministry of Education would be directed to look into creation of a modern Library in Ado-Odo Ota. He also promised to find a way to restore the Gateway Hotel, Ota and make it a befitting hotel. On Technical and Vocational Training, the Governor mentioned that a Special Adviser had been appointed to work on it. Also on teachers, the Governor said he would ensure that there was equal distribution of the newly appointed teachers across the three (3) Senatorial Districts to curb the issue of inadequate teachers in both public primary and secondary schools in Ogun State. About the rumor of pulling down the lucada bridge, that it was not true. On the celestial church route, the Governor said it was 100km road and would be prioritized in view of the paucity of fund.
- 8.4. The Governor rounded off his response by encouraging participants to continue to forward their contributions in writing to the appropriate quarters as they all would be properly captured and attended to and he thanked all for appreciating what his administration had done in the last two years and four months.
